For more than a century, Williams has been known as a reliable corporate partner. It's our privilege to help strengthen the fabric of the communities across the nation and the lives of our neighbors.


Our community giving is centered on:

IN-KIND DONATIONS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Besides cash donations, Williams provided needed items to schools and nonprofit organizations throughout 2022, such as computers and laptops to schools, as well as printing services to nonprofit organizations.

In 2022, Williams Print Services in Tulsa printed 45 projects for local nonprofit organizations valued at more than \$90,000.

UNITED WAY

We believe in the mission of the United Way — bringing people and organizations together to drive lasting change around the country and the world.

We supported 130 local area United Ways in 2022. As part of our total giving to United Way which totaled more than \$2.4 million, we matched fundraisers up to \$100,000 and all donations up to \$25,000 made by employees, retirees and board members to United Ways in states where we operate.



EDUCATION

We believe in helping local schools and preparing the next generation of employees for leading jobs with employers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields.

Williams donated more than \$1 million to STEM education in 2022.





HERE ARE SOME HIGHLIGHTS:

Williams is a multi-year supporter of the Wendell Scott Foundation in Danville, Virginia, an organization that aims to address racial disparities through educational attainment while honoring the memory of a NASCAR legend. Williams also supports financial literacy programs of Junior Achievement and its 3DE high school model. In Houston, we worked with 3DE students on a case study regarding solar installations.

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

As we partner to fuel the clean energy economy, we incorporate environmental stewardship into all of our decision-making. We want to preserve the environment for future generations while improving standards of living today. Community giving for environmental projects includes support of conservation districts, wildlife programs and youth education.

HERE ARE SOME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Williams donated to the restoration of the historic Safe Harbor Trestle Bridge in Manor Township, Pennsylvania, which had been closed to hikers, bikers and other outdoor enthusiasts for more than 30 years.
- Williams is helping complete conversion of the long-abandoned Northern Electric Trolley corridor in northeast Pennsylvania into a recreational trail for hikers and bikers.
- · In honor of the nonprofit's 50th anniversary, Williams is helping the Arbor Day Foundation replant 50,000 longleaf pine trees in North Carolina, South Carolina and Louisiana.
- We are one of the corporate funders of Williams Crossing, a new pedestrian bridge across the Arkansas River near our headquarters in downtown Tulsa.
- Williams is a key supporter of the Commons, a 26-acre multi-use development at Hermann Park Conservancy in Houston.

HERE ARE A FEW HIGHLIGHTS:

Williams sponsors several veterans-focused events, including the Travis Manion Foundation's 9-11 Heroes Run in Houston and Eagle Ops Welcome Home Run in Tulsa. Williams is a multi-year supporter of The University of South Carolina's Center for Civil Rights History and Research to fund the preservation of stories, a traveling exhibit and permanent collection. Williams' Employee Resource Groups incorporate supply drives and volunteer activities throughout the year, including a book drive during Black History Month.

PUBLIC SAFETY

We are committed to safeguarding our people, our neighbors, the environment and our assets. Safety is fundamental to everything we do and a key focus of our community giving.

In 2022, we donated over \$665,000 to more than 275 first responder groups throughout our operating areas, including departments where our employees volunteer as firefighters.

Grants to fire stations helped purchase personal protective equipment, rescue tools and upgrades to existing equipment. Grants to local sheriff and police stations helped purchase vests and upgrade communications through radio purchases.
